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Hungary and Venice. At the same time it granted a subsidy of arms and ammunition to George Balša. But mutual jealousies prevented the idea from being realised,¹

and in 1392 George himself was a prisoner in the hands of the Turks.² He was soon ransomed, but he lost Scutari, and his power was seriously shaken.

The year 1395 proved an unfortunate one for Ragusa.
